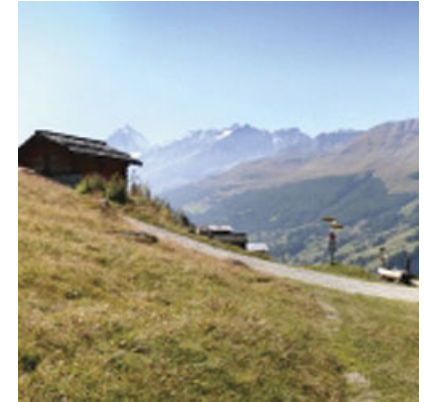
**CITYterm, Dobbs Ferry, NY**  
Students live in dorms on the Masters School campus and use their own experiences of New York City as the basis for their learning studying the history, literature, and environment of New York.



**High Mountain Institute, Colorado**  
11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grade students are given the opportunity to study the relationship between humanity and the natural world, including expeditions in the back country and lead a simple lifestyle while on campus.



**Island School, Bahamas**  
A model of sustainability, this school hosts a semester program for 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> grade students that explores solving real world ecological problems while encouraging teamwork and leadership skills and



**Swiss Semester, Zermatt, Switzerland**  
Fall semester program for 10<sup>th</sup> grade students from throughout the US. Students continue with most traditional Chadwick courses while having the opportunity to ski and take field trips to the surrounding countries.



**School for Ethical & Global Leadership, Washington, D.C.**  
Semester program for 11<sup>th</sup> grade students interested in pursuing business, law, and politics. Focuses include public speaking, constructive activism, debate, and a weekly class in Chinese & Arabic culture.



**Mountain School, Vermont**  
11<sup>th</sup> graders spend a semester with 45 students from public and private schools from across the US. English and environmental science classes are required. Simplicity and sustainability are core principles of this program, and agricultural practices are highlighted.



**New Zealand Study Network**  
California students ages 15-17 spend 3, 6, 9, or 12 months at one of five schools with similar core study programs, but vastly different elective options. Settings range from rural to urban and electives range from visual and performing arts to marine biology and outdoor education.



**School Year Abroad**  
11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders spend one year with a native family in China, France, Spain, or Italy while earning US graduation requirements and preparing for college admissions. Each program includes a course in the native language; the Spain program has a language prerequisite.
